Schoolcraft College's legacy is closely tied to our mission "to provide transformational learning experience designed to increase the capacity of individuals and groups to achieve intellectual, social and economic goals." During this past year I am proud to report that we continued to build on this legacy for both our students and the community.

Providing a transformational learning experience was again highlighted this year by seeing another of our students, Elis Shola, receive the prestigious Jack Kent Cooke scholarship.

We also expanded our academic programs to provide additional certificate and degree options in growing career areas, including Computer Information Systems, Manufacturing and Technology, Emergency Medical Technology, Fitness Leadership and Music.

The \$50,000 donation of a 110-ton injection-molding machine to our Plastic Technology program will strengthen our ability to prepare students for a career in this important manufacturing industry.

Our Business Development Center continues to positively impact the local community by offering courses and seminars that provide advice and assistance to entrepreneurs who want to start or grow their businesses.

Every day our faculty and staff work hard to help students and community members achieve their intellectual, social and economic goals. And the fruit of our labor is especially gratifying when we see so many of our alumni doing great things in their chosen careers. That is exemplified by our Distinguished Alumni Award recipient, Allen Cox, who used his Schoolcraft College education to begin his journey in public safety and reach the pinnacle of his profession as the Chief of Police and Director of Public Safety for the Plymouth, Michigan Police Department.

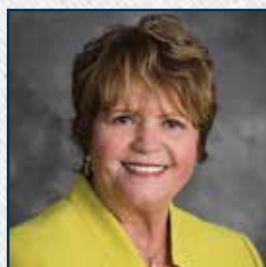

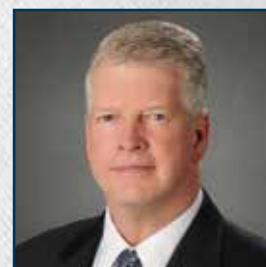

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AND DEDICATION PAY DIVIDENDS



Hard work, passion and dedication are three terms often used by Schoolcraft College's most recent Jack Kent Cooke Scholar, Elis Shola. "That's how you succeed at anything," Shola said. And succeed he has.

Shola is the sixth Schoolcraft College student to receive the prestigious Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship. He is one of only 55 students in the United States in 2017 to receive as much as \$40,000 a year (for up to three years) to pursue his higher education goals, which, in his case, include completion of a bachelor of science degree at the University of Michigan.

The scholarship is the largest private scholarship for two-year and community college transfer students in the country. This year nearly 3,000 students from more than 700 community colleges applied for the scholarship, which recognizes the nation's best low-income community college students

seeking to complete a bachelor's degree at an accredited college or university.

The academic advising staff encourage students to pursue this valuable scholarship. And their support has paid off with Schoolcraft College being one of only two community colleges in Michigan and only a handful of colleges in the United States to have six Jack Kent Cooke Scholars.

In his May 2017 commencement address, Shola told his fellow graduates, "There are no limits to what a human can achieve. The best part about a day is the fact that we all have 24 hours. Spend it wisely. Winston Churchill said, 'Continuous effort, not strength or intelligence, is the key to unlock every potential.'"



FROM SCHOOLCRAFT TO TOP COP

FBI training helped, but Allen Cox, the 2017 Schoolcraft College Distinguished Alumni Award recipient, started his climb to the top cop's job in the Plymouth Police Department by enrolling at Schoolcraft College.

After taking a few classes at the College after graduating high school, he went out of state to earn a bachelor's degree in political science and criminal justice and returned to Michigan to earn a master's degree in administration. After several years working as a correctional officer in the Federal Bureau of Prisons, he returned to Schoolcraft College to graduate in 1998 from the Wayne County Regional Police Training Center. He was immediately hired as a patrolman by the Plymouth Police Department.

He climbed through the Plymouth Police Department ranks until 2010 when he became Chief of Police and Director of Public Safety. Cox also is a graduate of Northwestern University's School of Police Staff and Command and the Federal Bureau of Investigation's training academy.

"While I never planned to be chief when I started," said Cox, "I've enjoyed my time in the position. Naturally, there are days that I miss being in the patrol car and responding to calls for service. Being chief, however, has afforded me

the opportunity to impact how the department does business."

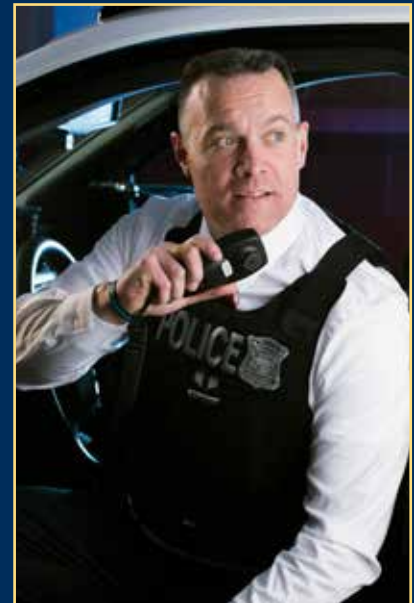
One impact is his own departmental awards and commendation program, "a way for employees to be publicly recognized in front of their family and friends for going above and beyond," he said.

He does recall an experience he had before becoming chief – one he says he'll never forget and speaks to the importance of cooperation among law enforcement agencies and professionals. When Cox was in the Plymouth Police Department's detective bureau, "An FBI agent came to ask my help," he said. "A former resident was attempting to have his ex-wife, who still lived in the area, murdered."

However, Cox said the "hit man" this former resident hired was actually an FBI informant. At the FBI's request, Cox contacted the suspect to set up a sting that eventually led to his arrest.

"I told him I was investigating a very serious assault on his ex-wife, as if the 'hit' had been attempted and failed," Cox said. "About two weeks later the suspect paid the FBI informant for the attempted hit and was immediately taken into custody, and was eventually convicted and sentenced to 45 years in prison."

All in a day's work for this law enforcement officer who now serves as Chief for one of Schoolcraft College's local communities.



SIX NEW ACADEMIC PROGRAMS ADDED TO EDUCATIONAL OPTIONS



This past year has seen the expansion of six academic programs at Schoolcraft College that offer additional certificates and degrees in growing career areas:

- ♦ The Computer Information System program added the Cisco Networking Academy Skills Certificate designed to provide students with an understanding of network fundamentals, proficiency working with network equipment such as routers and switches, and the latest local and wide area network technologies in preparation to achieve the Cisco Certified Network Associate (CCNA) certification.
- ♦ Manufacturing and Technology also expanded its offerings with the new Mechatronics program and the addition of a Plastic Technology

Associate of Applied Science (AAS) Degree. The Mechatronics program offers a Skills Certificate, Certificate and AAS Degree and enables students to learn about the integration of mechanical, electrical, fluid power and computer technologies that control machine movements, an important part of the ever-changing manufacturing process.

The Plastic Technology AAS Degree curriculum focuses on thermoplastic processes with an emphasis on injection molding and the most frequently used thermoplastic materials and is another educational option in addition to the Plastic Technology Skills Certificate and Certificate.



- ♦ As the need for emergency medical personnel continues to grow, Schoolcraft College has added an Emergency Medical Technology (EMT) Skills Certificate to its educational options that also include an EMT Paramedic Certificate and EMT Paramedic AAS Degree. The new EMT Skills Certificate prepares students for employment as pre-hospital emergency medical providers. It is also required for entry into the EMT Paramedic Certificate program.
- ♦ The Fitness Leadership program is designed to prepare students for the kinesiology profession. The program enables students to earn either a Fitness Leadership

Certificate or AAS Degree. Students who earn the certificate will be qualified to be a personal trainer while those choosing to complete the associate degree are likely to transfer to a four-year school to earn a bachelor's degree and get involved in other areas of the physical fitness industry.

- ♦ The Music program has recently been expanded to include three unique certificate programs aimed at helping pianists who are interested in having a successful career as private piano teachers – the Piano Skills Teacher Certificate, Piano Teacher Certificate and the Piano Teacher Advanced Certificate.

Sometimes what starts as a very small step turns into a large, important journey. That's pretty much the story of Schoolcraft College's Business Development Center (BDC) since its inception in 1985. Opening its doors 21 years after the College itself, the BDC was the first nonprofit business development center in western Wayne County.

From the beginning to the present, the BDC has offered advice and assistance to business people who want to start or grow their own businesses or get involved in government contracting. The BDC also provides job training to those without jobs and helps companies fill jobs by preparing qualified workers through customized training.

With crucial programs that help entrepreneurs launch, grow, transition and innovate, the BDC has trained more than 13,000 "students" since 2010 alone. During that time, the

BDC assisted 65 small businesses start up and obtain more than \$45 million in capital.

Last year, through the BDC's Procurement Technical Assistance Center (PTAC), clients received more than \$440 million in government contracts. Since 1985, local businesses have secured \$2.8 billion in contracts with the PTAC staff's assistance.

In an average year, the BDC assists more than 1,000 businesses through training, consulting and other resources.

Tammy Thomson, director of the BDC, says, "We also consult directly with employers to enhance their current workforce and deliver training in everything from technical skills to soft skills and management or leadership abilities. It's rare for a community college to have all of these business services under one roof."

FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS RESPOND TO CHANGING NEEDS OF STUDENTS

In keeping with its Mission, the Schoolcraft College Foundation, founded in 1966, has continued to grow and change as needed in response to the changing needs of the College and the community it serves.

OUR MISSION

The Mission of the Schoolcraft College Foundation is to support the programs, purposes and initiatives of Schoolcraft College. We do this by securing resources to provide scholarships for students, funds for innovative and emerging initiatives developed by our faculty and staff for the benefit of the campus community, and other initiatives important to meeting the mission of Schoolcraft College.

Scholarships for individuals are one of many ways the Foundation provides support.

For many students, financial aid in one form or another is a necessity for them to realize their dream of a college education. Working in conjunction with the Financial Aid Office, the Foundation and the College awarded 1,530 scholarships providing more than \$1.4 million to students in 2016-17.

Foundation scholarships are generally funded by individual donors or organizations. Many are established as endowments or in honor or memory of someone. Some are restricted to be awarded to students studying in a specific area or field; others may have a minimum grade point average requirement; and some, but not all, are designated for students with demonstrated financial need.

From the more than 150 Scholarship Funds managed by the Foundation, awards generally range from \$400 to \$2,000 dependent upon the balance available in the fund from donations or investment revenues in the case of endowments, and the needs of the student.

In addition to scholarships, many students received financial aid assistance, including nearly \$14 million in federal, approximately \$1 million in state grant awards and nearly \$10 million in loans in 2016-17.

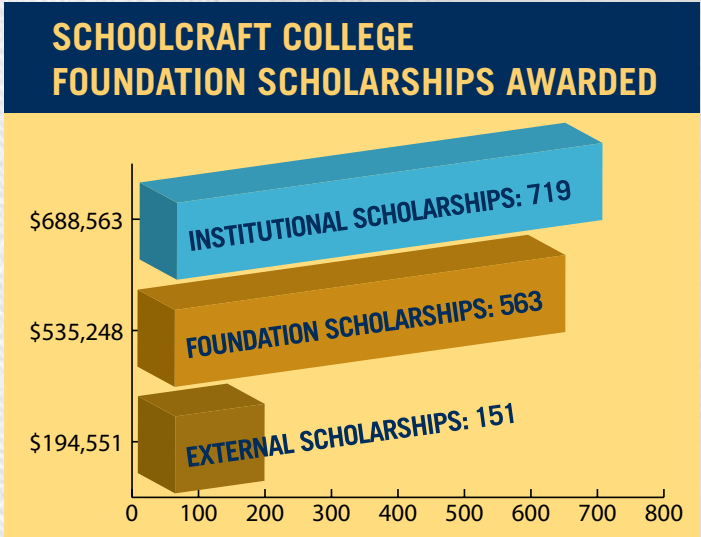

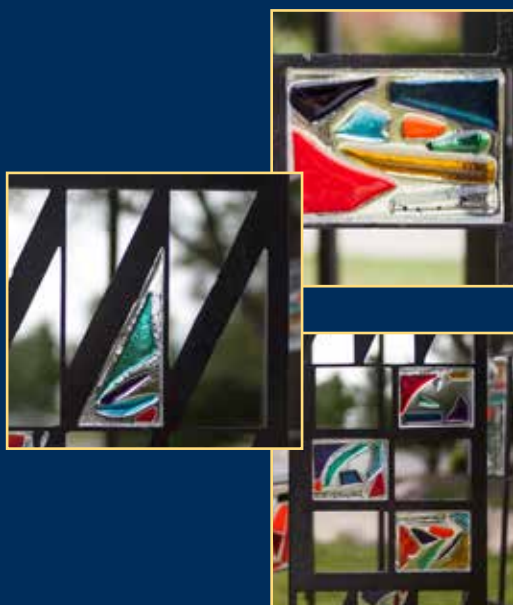
Schoolcraft students attend the Welding Technology program to learn both hands-on welding skills

and knowledge of metallurgy and other materials. Instructors work closely with students in limited class sizes to provide hands-on training and relay knowledge of analytical skills required by modern industrial technology.

The Welding Technology program includes 22 classes through which students can earn one or more of several stackable credentials including a Welding Sculpture Skills Certificate, Fabrication Certificate, Fabrication Technology Associate of Applied Science Degree, and a Pre-Apprenticeship Certificate.

CORPORATE PARTNERSHIPS ENHANCE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT



Two major donations of injection-molding machines to Schoolcraft College's Plastic Technology program ensure students will get first-hand experience that can enhance their future career opportunities in the plastics manufacturing industry.

In an effort to help develop the manufacturing skilled workforce of the future, International Automotive Concepts donated a \$50,000 110-ton Krauss-Maffei injection molding machine to the College. The machine is currently in use by the Plastic Technology Lab as part of the Plastic Technology program. In addition, machine manufacturer Krauss-Maffei donated a larger 200-ton all electric injection-molding machine with a robotic attachment. This larger machine is currently in storage while the College prepares proper lab space for its use.

The Plastic Technology program offers students three educational options: a Skills Certificate; Certificate; and an Associate of Applied Science Degree. The curriculum is designed to help students acquire knowledge, skills and behaviors necessary to become a



competent molding machine operator, technician, or process engineer. The program explores plastic materials, processes, equipment and tooling, troubleshooting, maintenance, quality and safety. This unique program includes a combination of lecture and lab courses, and assignments at local plastic manufacturing companies that can give students an advantage as they pursue a career in this growing industry.

"The lack of highly-skilled workers is one of the biggest challenges facing manufacturers today, especially with the advancements we are seeing in manufacturing technology," said Robert Leadley, dean of occupational programs for Schoolcraft College. "These two high-tech machines will be totally integrated into our Plastic Technology program so students can learn about the design of plastic parts in class and then apply their learnings in the Plastic Technology lab."

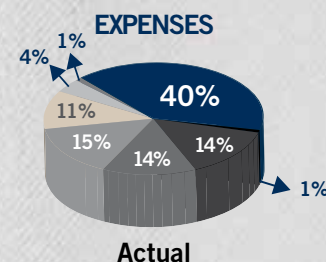

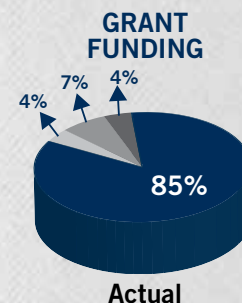

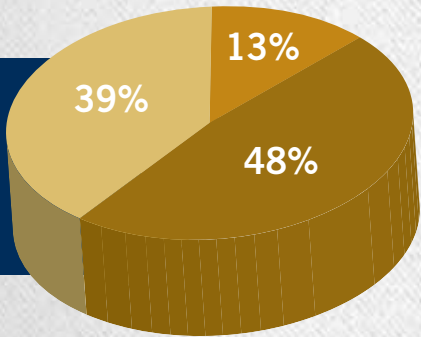

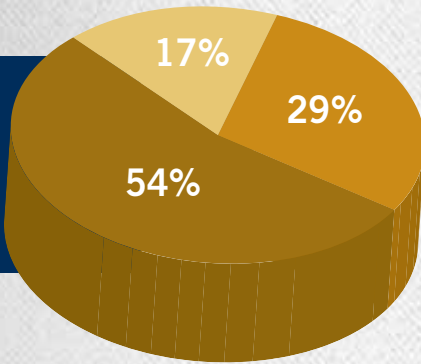
