

Culinary Extravaganza Delights Eyes and Palates

he annual Schoolcraft College Foundation Culinary Extravaganza, held September 21st, was a chance to feast the eyes on the new VisTaTech Center as well as indulge in many gourmet delights. Approximately 60 eateries and wineries participated in this fundraiser, providing samples of their most exciting offerings to more than 1,000 patrons. This year's co-chairs were John Bowen of Novi Expo Center and Suzanne Thomas-Hughes of Flagstar Bank.

Restaurant and beverage distributors competed for the Best Table Display award, using various food or seasonal themes. Sodexho received this award.

Patrons attended a free wine tasting seminar, and voted for their favorite restaurant. LaBistecca won The People's Choice first place award, with Loving Spoonful second and The Farm third.



A live auction followed the wine tasting, with patrons bidding on such favorites as a Mackinac Island getaway, a northern Michigan weekend retreat, a private ice skating party for 40, or a hot air balloon ride. New this year on the auction block was a reprint of a Thomas Arvid painting valued at \$3,500, donated by Ray Frederick and Chris Peppo of Sterling Services. Arvid uses wine as the focus of his works. A silent auction proved to be a popular stopping spot where patrons bid on Lions and Red Wings tickets, and spa and dinner certificates.

The 86,000 square-foot VisTaTech Center, which houses the student-run American Harvest Restaurant, instructional kitchens for Culinary Arts, and various presentation areas for receptions, meetings and banquets, enhanced the entire event for patrons and restaurateurs by showcasing the facility and all that it has to offer. The event raised \$105,000 for student scholarships at the college.



VisTaTech Officially Opens

The campus and community celebrated the grand opening of the VisTaTech Center

Friday, Sept. 5 with an elaborate event, yet one that had the feeling of an open house among good friends. Guests could take guided tours or simply wander around the new \$27 million building on their own, snack on delicious food prepared by Culinary Arts staff and students, or get a taste of the latest technology.

At the official ribbon-cutting ceremony, President Conway A. Jeffress called the building a college icon, a graphic symbol of the vision and forward thinking that characterizes the college, as well as an instrument for furthering the college's core purpose.

Speakers included Board of Trustees President Mary Breen, College President Emeritus Richard McDowell, Wayne County Executive Robert Ficano, State Senator Laura Toy, and spokespersons for U.S. Congressman Joe Knollenburg and overall construction project manager Barton Mallow.

Speakers uniformly praised the building's beauty, functionality and technology, and the college's commitment to the intellectual and economic welfare of the community.

The new building is debt free, paid for by a combination of state, federal, college and donor funds. "I find this

building to be splendid," said Jeffress.
"We built it with no millage or bond issue to the taxpayers, no excess burden on the students, and no tin cups at the door. We still operate under the rule, 'First we save, then we spend."



During the ceremony, Jeffress received the designation Eminent Wisdom Fellow from the Wisdom Hall of Fame, conferred by Dr. E.J. McClendon, Plymouth educator, friend of the college and past recipient of a Schoolcraft honorary degree.




